1. Privacy at a Glance

General Information

The following notes provide a simple overview of what happens to your personal data when you visit this website. Personal data is any data by which you can be personally identified. Detailed information on the subject of data protection can be found in our privacy policy listed below this text.

Data Collection on Our Website

- **Who is responsible for data collection on this website?** The data processing on this website is carried out by the website operator. You can find their contact details in the "Information on the Responsible Party" section of this privacy policy.
- **How do we collect your data?** On the one hand, your data is collected when you communicate it to us. This can be, for example, data that you enter into our contact form. Other data is collected automatically or with your consent by our IT systems when you visit the website. This is mainly technical data (e.g., internet browser, operating system, or time of the page view). This data is collected automatically as soon as you enter this website.
- **What do we use your data for?** Part of the data is collected to ensure the error-free provision of the website. Other data may be used to analyze your user behavior. Data that you send us in the context of inquiries or orders will be used exclusively for processing and carrying out your mixing and mastering project.
- **What rights do you have regarding your data?** You have the right to receive information about the origin, recipient, and purpose of your stored personal data free of charge at any time. You also have the right to request the correction or deletion of this data. If you have given your consent to data processing, you can revoke this consent at any time for the future. You also have the right to lodge a complaint with the competent supervisory authority.

2. General Notes and Mandatory Information

Data Protection

The operators of this website take the protection of your personal data very seriously. We treat your personal data confidentially and in accordance with the statutory data protection regulations and this privacy policy.

When you use this website, various personal data are collected. This privacy policy explains what data we collect and what we use it for. It also explains how and for what purpose this happens.

We point out that data transmission over the Internet (e.g., communication by e-mail) can have security gaps. Complete protection of data against access by third parties is not possible.

The responsible party (controller) is the natural or legal person who alone or jointly with others decides on the purposes and means of processing personal data (e.g., names, e-mail addresses, etc.).

Storage Duration

Unless a more specific storage period has been specified in this privacy policy, your personal data will remain with us until the purpose for processing the data no longer applies. If you assert a legitimate request for deletion or revoke your consent to data processing, your data will be deleted unless we have other legally permissible reasons for storing your personal data (e.g., tax or commercial law retention periods); in the latter case, the deletion takes place after these reasons cease to apply.

Revocation of Your Consent to Data Processing

Many data processing operations are only possible with your express consent. You can revoke consent you have already given at any time. The legality of the data processing carried out until the revocation remains unaffected by the revocation.

Right to Lodge a Complaint with the Competent Supervisory Authority

In the event of violations of the GDPR, data subjects have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority, in particular in the Member State of their habitual residence, their place of work, or the place of the alleged violation.

Right to Data Portability

You have the right to have data that we process automatically on the basis of your consent or in fulfillment of a contract handed over to you or to a third party in a common, machine-readable format. If you request the direct transfer of the data to another controller, this will only be done to the extent that it is technically feasible.

Access, Rectification, and Deletion

Within the framework of the applicable statutory provisions, you have the right to free information about your stored personal data, its origin and recipient, and the purpose of the data processing and, if applicable, a right to correction or deletion of this data at any time. 3. Data Collection on Our Website

Hosting by Strato

We host our website with Strato AG (Pascalstraße 10, 10587 Berlin, Germany). When you visit our website, Strato collects various log files including your IP addresses. Details can be found in Strato's privacy policy: <https://www.strato.de/datenschutz/>.

The use of Strato is based on Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. We have a legitimate interest in the most reliable presentation of our website.

Contact Form

If you send us inquiries via the contact form, your details from the inquiry form, including the contact details you provided there, will be stored by us for the purpose of processing the inquiry and in the event of follow-up questions. We do not pass on this data without your consent.

The processing of this data is based on Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR if your request is related to the fulfillment of a contract or is necessary for the implementation of pre-contractual measures. In all other cases, the processing is based on our legitimate interest in the effective processing of inquiries addressed to us (Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR) or on your consent (Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR) if this was requested.

The data you enter in the contact form will remain with us until you request us to delete it, revoke your consent to storage, or the purpose for data storage no longer applies (e.g., after your inquiry has been completely processed). Mandatory statutory provisions – in particular retention periods – remain unaffected.

WordPress and Elementor Plugin

This website is based on the WordPress content management system and uses the "Elementor" plugin for visual design. These tools run locally on our server at Strato. No personal data is transferred to third-party providers or the developers of these plugins.

Native Audio Player (HTML)

An audio player is integrated into our website, allowing you to listen to audio samples of our mixing and mastering work. This player is based entirely on native HTML code and loads the audio files directly from our own server (hosted by Strato). There is no data exchange with external audio platforms (such as SoundCloud or Spotify). When playing a song, only the technically necessary server log files (such as your IP address) are processed by our host to enable the file to be streamed (Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR).

4. Data Processing for Mixing & Mastering Orders

If you commission us for audio services (mixing, mastering), we process further specific data for contract fulfillment or the implementation of pre-contractual measures (Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR):

- **Audio and Project Data:** We store and process the audio files (stems, multitracks, stereo mixes), song titles, artist names, and metadata uploaded or sent by you solely for the purpose of processing your order.
- **Billing and Payment Data:** For invoicing and bookkeeping, we collect your full

name, address, and payment details.

Storage and Retention of Audio Files

Your submitted project data, sessions, and finished audio files are stored for an indefinite period of time on our secure storage media. This is done in our and your legitimate interest (Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR) in order to offer you the opportunity to request updates, re-masterings, radio edits, or backups of your songs even years later and beyond statutory warranty periods. You can object to the storage of your project data for the future at any time; in this case, the data will be deleted after the expiry of the statutory (tax and commercial law) retention obligations for invoice documents.

Data Transfer via WeTransfer

To transmit large audio files (especially multitracks and stems), we use the service **WeTransfer** (WeTransfer B.V., Willem Fenengastrat 19, 1096 BL Amsterdam, Netherlands). When you send us data via WeTransfer or we provide you with finished mixes/masterings, your files and your e-mail address are processed on WeTransfer's servers. The use is based on Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR (performance of a contract) and our legitimate interest in a secure, fast, and high-performance data transmission of large media content (Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR). Payment Processing via Bank Transfer

Payment for our services is made via classic bank transfer after invoicing. In this process, the transfer data you provide (name of the account holder, IBAN, BIC, purpose of payment, amount, and date of the booking) are processed by our bank. This processing is strictly necessary for the fulfillment of the contract (Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR) and to comply with statutory accounting and tax obligations (Art. 6 (1) lit. c GDPR).

5. Analysis Tools and Plugins

Site Kit by Google

We use the WordPress plugin **Site Kit by Google** on our website (Google Ireland Limited, Gordon House, Barrow Street, Dublin 4, Ireland). This plugin is used to conveniently integrate Google services into our WordPress website.

By activating Site Kit, data (such as your IP address and information about your use of our website) may be transmitted to Google and stored on Google servers (possibly also in the USA). The use of this service only takes place if you have given your express consent via our cookie or privacy banner (Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR).
